FREE Employment & Training Assistance



The YWCA offers intensive and individualized employment services for different populations. To enroll, participants must meet eligibility guidelines listed below. Services may include case management, job readiness training, tuition vouchers for vocational training, assistance for required job related items, transportation assistance, job placement, and job retention services.

YWCA employment programs are located at YWCA's Career Centers which provide job search resources including job postings, job search computers, resume and interview skills workshops, computer skills training, and hiring events open to all job seekers.

YWCA Employment Programs Include:

Homeless Intervention Program (HIP): Offers homeless adults intensive, employment, and housing-focused case management including short-term skills training, comprehensive referrals and direct support. Employment and Housing Stability (EHS): Assists low-income people in finding permanent jobs leading to self-sufficiency and stable housing. Clients receive case management, support services and assistance with job search, housing search and 12 months of job retention. Basic Food Employment and Training (BFET): Helping individuals receiving food stamps with job search, job readiness, vocational training, support services and job placement. King County Jobs Initiative (KCJI): Serving ex-offenders with employment re-entry services and targeted job training including construction, environmental, culinary, manufacturing and others.
